He supported local professional teams like the 49ers and the Golden State Warriors but for soccer, he supported the Mexico national team. Oswaldo would participate in pick-up soccer games at Fuller Park when his family had birthday parties or barbecues. Oswaldo enjoyed spending his time off from work with his close family at home watching redbox movies and eating massive bowls of delicious popcorn that Marisa would make from scratch. Oswaldo was very open when it came to food. Being picky with food was something that did not exist within him because he showed his family that they had to value anything that was placed on their plate because God provided the proper and

necessary foods. Not only did he value just food, he valued everything he had to the absolute fullest, he let nothing go to waste. All who knew Oswaldo admired him dearly for his personal drive, his determination, his caring for others and his wonderful warm smile and sense of humor. 
