Charles David "Buzz" Boyanich, 68, of Napa, died Jan. 4, 2023 at a local hospital following a lengthy illness.

Born May 5, 1954 in San Francisco, he was the son of the late Stanley Elia and Olga Milovich Boyanich. Buzz attended local schools and was a graduate of Burlington High School. He attended the College of San Mateo and in 1982 made Napa his home where he joined in the family business, Key Industrial. At the time of its founding in 1949 by Buzz's father, Key Industrial was concentrated mainly in the dairy industry. In later years, the firm served a variety of industries requiring its specialized sanitary equipment including pharmaceutical and wine production venues. Buzz served as president prior to his retirement.

Buzz was well loved and his wife remembers him as "...kind, gentle, generous, and loyal". He could make any situation lighter and was often heard encouraging "Have fun with it!"

Buzz was preceded in death by his parents and siblings: Roberta, Stanley and John. He is survived by his loving wife Mary Atman-Boyanich; her two sons,

Adrian and Jeremiah Atman; and Jeremiah's two sons, Warren and Howell Atman.
